Year 7 History Visit - Black Country Living Museum Thursday 30 June 2022

The History Department has arranged a day visit to the Black Country Museum on Thursday 30 June 2022, which is Extended Project Day 4.

The Black Country Museum is an open-air museum with an excellent reputation for showing town life in the late nineteenth and early twentieth century Britain. Our tour guides for the day are dressed in costume. Students will visit a Victorian school to take part in a school lesson. Students could also visit an ironmonger, a sweet shop and a workingman's house as well as hearing about life as a miner.

The day provides students with an exciting experience of many of the ideas they will study in History in the summer term and to understand how the Industrial Revolution changed the landscape and way of life of ordinary people.

We are asking for a contribution of £21 to cover the cost of this trip. As per our charging and remission policy, this activity will only be able to go ahead if we are able to cover the cost through voluntary contributions. Our preferred payment method is now online, via ParentPay. This can be accessed through the school website or directly at www.parentpay.com. Please contact the Finance Office if you need a ParentPay password or assistance. All educational visit payment records, instalment payments, and running balances can now be tracked online. (Cash and cheques will also be accepted).

For students to be able to participate in educational visits, school organised events or school related activities, good student behaviour is of paramount importance. If a student presents regular poor behaviours in school and/or we consider that the student presents a significant, unmanageable or unacceptable risk to the health, safety and/or welfare of that student or others on the educational visit, including the adult leaders, the student is unlikely to be able to participate.

Students should bring a packed lunch and will need to wear school uniform. Students should wear comfortable shoes, which can on this occasion include training shoes. A suitable outdoor coat is required as we are outside all day, regardless of the weather. Students could bring a small amount of spending money to spend at the "Old Tyme Fairground", Sweet Shop, Museum Shop or the authentic fish and chip shop.
