





Admissions Criteria for Year 6 into 7 students - 2022

Oversubscription Criteria	<p>Places will be allocated to pupils who have an Education Health Care (EHC) Plan that names the school as appropriate provision. When there are more applications for places than there are places available, priority will be given in the following order:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Children in public care or previously in public care but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangements or special guardianship order. ii. Pupils who live in the linked area associated with the school: - Appletree, Aston-le-Walls, Chacombe, Chipping Warden, Culworth, Edgcote, Farthinghoe, Greatworth, Kings Sutton, Lower Boddington, Marston St Lawrence, Middleton Cheney, Moreton Pinkney, Overthorpe, Plumpton, Stuchbury, Sulgrave, Thenford, Thorpe Mandeville, Upper Boddington, Warkworth, Weedon Lois, Weston and Wappenham. iii. Pupils who will have an older brother or sister continuing at Chenderit School who is expected to remain on roll at the time of admission of the younger child. iv. Pupils attending the designated contributory Primary Schools: Boddington, Chacombe, Chipping Warden, Culworth, Farthinghoe, Greatworth, Kings Sutton, Middleton Cheney, St Loys, St Mary's Catholic Primary and continuing in attendance until the final offer of places is made. v. Pupils selected for their aptitude in the visual arts. A maximum of 10% will be selected through the presentation of a portfolio and assessments as to aptitude. (If you are applying for one of the aptitude places you will need to submit a portfolio to the school by the closing date, which is 5.00pm Friday 15th October 2021. (Please contact the school directly for details of what to include in your portfolio – details are available on the school website). vi. Children of a member of staff who has been directly employed by Chenderit School for a period of not less than 2 calendar years at the time of the child's application and/or the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage leading to the child's admission in the following academic year. vii. Other pupils.
Other Information	 Distance Tiebreaker - If the admission number is exceeded within criterion (v), priority will be given according to the aptitude scores. If the admission number is exceeded within any other criterion priority will be given to those who live closest to the school measured in a straight line using NCC's GIS.
Other Information	 Chenderit School admissions are administered by the Northants County Council Admissions Team and can be contacted via the Northants County Council website – school admissions.  Applicants who are not successful with the offer of a school place have a right to appeal. Applicants not offered a place are sent details of the Appeals procedure and can also ask to be placed on the school's Waiting List. Appeals are administered by the Northants County Council Admissions team, alongside an independent panel and are usually conducted in Northampton. The outcome of the appeal is notified to the applicant and school in writing once the final decision by the independent panel is made.
